City Manager's Message

René Bobadilla City Manager As your City Manager and Chief Negotiator, I am proud to announce we've reached an enormous first time accomplishment in the City's 101 year history. On April 27 your City Council accepted and approved employee Memorandums of Understanding for the first time. Montebello has long suffered from a culture of entitlement and lack of fairness that left many new and long-term employees feeling disenfranchised and marginalized. For many decades, generations of Montebello employees worked for—or served—the City honorably and selflessly, but unfortunately, without the benefit of having comprehensive Memorandums of Understanding (referred to as MOUs) in place. Establishing these MOUs is a hallmark of effective leadership and support in creating and sustaining a healthy work environment and a critical milestone in establishing employee equity.

Montebello's very poor financial standing and combative workplace culture were well known to our peers across the County of Los Angeles. Related to this, City employees historically requested a class and compensation study for decades. In late 2021, we provided them one for the first time ever in the City's history. The MOUs formally approved by City Council represent countless hours, weeks and months of honest and open negotiations between City staff and our represented employee groups, using this first ever class and compensation study as a baseline.

It's important all residents understand MOUs are a universally standardized platform used by countless American cities, states and federal government agencies to fairly and uniformly negotiate with their employees. The MOUs approved by Council will address long standing disparities that include:

- 1. Discrepancies in paid holidays and standard accrual leave (sick, vacation, holiday paid time);
- 2. Recognition of employee educational achievements in their compensation;
- 3. Correction of many disparities across our workforce agreements in other words standardizing items for fairness.

We have generated tremendous progress and momentum in our relationship with employees through things like:

- Improved communications through regular all-employee meetings;
- Restructuring our workers compensation program to more efficiently manage injured employees and return them to work successfully;
- Increased access to information by providing employees online tools for pay stubs and W-2s;
- A better quality work environment with improvements to City buildings and offices;
- Progressive computer system upgrades City-wide.

We've been learning, listening and growing together – all while keeping Montebello functional during the challenges of an unprecedented world pandemic where we had to learn to adjust to employee and workplace needs during extended stay-at-home orders. Today, as opposed to just two years ago, we are even more committed to investing in the City's most important asset: its employees. It's the men and women of all ranks and positions that are responsible for keeping Montebello up and running and responsive to resident needs everyday – all day. It's our duty as leaders to engage with all of them openly and honestly through processes such as labor negotiations that demonstrate the honor, trust and respect they deserve.

If we achieve this and continue to move positively in this direction, Montebello will be stronger than it's ever been and will regain the respect and admiration of those watching us.

Welcome New Chief of Police

Paul M. Espinosa was appointed as Montebello's eleventh Chief of Police on April 11, 2022.

Chief Espinosa has served 28

years with the LAPD and brings a wealth of knowledge and insight having operated among 11 different LAPD stations and within many of their specialized divisions including training, community policing, gang impact and narcotic enforcement.

Born and raised in the San Fernando Valley, Chief Espinosa attended California State University, Northridge, where he obtained a Bachelor's Degree in Political Science with an emphasis in Urban Studies.

In 1994, he started his career as a police officer for the Los Angeles Police Department (LAPD), working in patrol, bicycle detail, prostitution enforcement detail, vice, narcotics, and staff research.

His dedication and knowledge within the department promoted him to the rank of sergeant in 2002, where he supervised community relations and acted as an Investigator for a Special Operations Division. Chief Espinosa also held the rank of detective, where he investigated major assaults, crimes, and burglaries.

From 2012 to 2019, Chief Espinosa gradually moved up the ranks of the LAPD and was eventually assigned as the Commanding Officer for the entire West Valley Area.

Now joining the Montebello team, Chief Espinosa is looking forward to working with Montebello's resident community and officers to help improve the safety and quality of life in the City for all residents. "I am honored to accept this important and vital position serving Montebello," said Chief Espinosa. "I look forward to working with each and every member of the Police Department, the City Council and City leaders to ensure we find meaningful ways to enhance policing and public safety. I want to work collaboratively with all stakeholders to create a culture of protection and service that focuses on improving the quality of life here in Montebello."

In addition to dedicating time to LAPD and his family, Chief Espinosa enjoys running, cycling, swimming, and almost all outdoor athletic activities. Family, faith, public service, and fitness are his priorities in life. He is an active member of several external law enforcement groups including the Latin American and Asian and Pacific Islanders Law Associations. He is currently pursuing a master of law enforcement at the University of San Diego.






100 Years of Excellence

The Montebello Fire Department is proud to be celebrating a century of service to the City of Montebello and its residents. Commissioned on June 20, 1922, the Montebello Fire Department's core values of courage, commitment, and community remain as true today as the day the it was founded.

Under the watchful eye of the first Fire Chief, Edward M. Schaak, the Fire Department was made up of volunteers known as "Call Men". They handled fires, other emergencies, and were paid \$1.50 to \$5.00 per run depending on their job, their experience, and the time involved.

The Department's current roster of 52 firefighter/paramedics responded to 6,000 calls in fiscal year 2020/2021, a far cry from the four fire calls the Department received back in 1922. However, its dedication to providing the best service possible, exhibiting professionalism and compassion, remains as steadfast today as it did 100 years ago.

Under the current leadership of Chief Fernando Pelaez, the Department looks forward to serving the Montebello community well into the next 100 years.



Be Safe This July 4th

Did you know more than 19,500 reported fires are started by fireworks annually? According to the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission, children under 4 years experience the highest number of injuries due to firework accidents. The Montebello Fire Department encourages everyone and their families to be aware of the following firework safety tips this July 4th holiday:

- Safe and Sane approved fireworks are ONLY allowed on July 4th from noon - 10 p.m.
- Always have an adult present.
- Use fireworks outdoors only.
- Never use near dry grass or other flammable materials.
- Keep a safe distance & light only one at a time.
- Never point or throw fireworks at another person.
- Never experiment with or "fix" fireworks.
- Have a bucket of water and a hose handy.

Montebello Police will be enforcing firework laws during the 4^{th} of July. Violators may face a \$1,000 fine or possible arrest. Fireworks are not allowed in the City before or after the 4^{th} of July.

Montebello Now Votes by Districts


