Matthew Ramos Named New Deputy Director of Planning & Community Development

Montebello, CA – The City of Montebello has named Matthew Ramos its new Deputy Director of Planning and Community Development. Ramos has worked for the City for nearly two years and has overseen the transition of parking enforcement duties from Montebello's Police Department to the City's Code Enforcement division. His other official duties include managing and coordinating redevelopment projects around the community and a variety economic development programs. This move was intentionally orchestrated to free up vital public safety personnel so the Police Department can focus on crime and community safety needs.

"We intend to expand our parking enforcement efforts community-wide," said Ramos. "Residents and the public can expect a higher response to parking control concerns and expect more parking enforcement officers to pro-actively address violations such as abandoned vehicles, parking on a red curb, alley parking, street sweeping enforcement, and violations of posted parking limitations."

Parking Enforcement officers will be assisted by additional enforcement staff from Inter-Con Security, which will enable a better response to a growing number of resident and business complaints about parking issues. Parking Enforcement officers will now be able to respond and monitor posted parking signs and regulations with greater frequency and personnel.

"I look forward to improving public safety and parking concerns city-wide," said Ramos. "I advise all residents and community members to pay attention to posted parking signs, note days and hours of violations for street sweeping, and help cooperate by obeying signs or parking vehicles safely so no one has to receive an unwanted citation".

The City of Montebello was founded in 1920 and is located eight miles southeast of downtown Los Angeles. Its history dates back to the days of the Franciscan missionaries and today boasts a full array of services including police, fire and one of the region's largest public transportation systems, Montebello Bus Lines. The city's multi-cultural resident population is approximately 65,000 covering a footprint of approximately four square miles.
